
Shouldn't you be using Six Sigma?

The four most popular levels of Six Sigma training are offered through the HTECH — Vincennes University Partnership

Executive — (1 day training)

This level is responsible for establishing the vision for Six Sigma implementation. They empower the other role holders with the freedom and resources to explore new ideas for improvements.

Black Belt —

(20 days + Cross Functional Project)

This level of management applies the Six Sigma methodology to the specific projects. They devote 100% of their time to Six Sigma project execution.

Green Belt — (10 days + Local Project)
Green Belts are employees who assume the
Six Sigma implementation along with their other
responsibilities and work under the guidance of
the Black Belts working to achieve the overall
results.

Yellow Belt — (3 day training)

This level of training gives employees a greater understanding of the process, allowing each to provide meaningful assistance in achieving the firm's Six Sigma goal.
